SENIOR PARENT NIGHT: Will be held virtually on Wednesday, September 29th! There will be presentations on Scholarships, Graduation, AAA, Financial Aid, and Josten's. Parents and students seeking important information regarding their child's senior year and preparation for the next step should view this.

SCHOLARSHIPS: The **Feroah Center for College and Career Exploration**, is the best and most easily accessible resource for learning about colleges, scholarships, and Financial Aid information. While there will be in person hours available, we highly encourage students and parents to regularly check the RHS College & Career Center website throughout the school year for the latest websites, applications, and general advice. The **Senior Bulletin** is published monthly by Ms. Ortiz and will be posted to the website. The RHS College & Career website link is <https://www.washoeschools.net/renohsccc>.

RHS General Scholarships: We are fortunate to have many scholarships that are designated for RHS students only. You need only fill out one application to be considered for all of them. The **RHS GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION** will be available on the College & Career website starting October 1st. The application needs to be completed by **January 15, 2022**, it will close at 12 a.m., Students may make an appointment to visit the Career and Career Center and meet with Ms. Ortiz if you have any questions.

Millennium Scholarship: There is no application process. Eligible Nevada high school graduates will be notified of their award by mail the first week of August 2022. Please refer to the Millennium Scholarship website for eligibility criteria: https://www.nevadatreasurer.gov/GGMS/GGMS_Home/

FINANCIAL AID: The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) could qualify you for grants, loans, and work-study. Apply on-line at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>. The 2021/2022 application will be available **October 1, 2021**. Students will create an FSA ID with an email address and security questions. Keep in a safe place as this is valid for 10 years. Federal financial need is based on family economic situation and applications are evaluated on a first-come/first-serve basis. **March 1, 2022** is the priority deadline for Univ. of Nevada students.

COLLEGE FAIR: The tentatively scheduled in person October 24th College Fair **has been canceled**. In lieu of in person, it is being restructured into a series of virtual events during October. The series of events will include topics such as FAFSA, scholarships, essay writing, letters of recommendation, etc. More information from the district to follow so save the date!

UNR: UNR's 2022-2023 application for admission opens on September 15th (<https://www.unr.edu/admissions>)

- **Early Action Application Deadline: November 15, 2021**
- **Regular Admission Deadline** (To be considered for Scholarships): **February 1, 2022**
- **Scholarship Application Deadline (separate application from admissions): February 15, 2022**
- **Honors College Priority Deadline February 1, 2022** (must have done regular admission application first)
- **Final Admissions Deadline** (NO Scholarship Consideration) **April 7, 2022**

UNR Applicants must have the following to be considered for admission:

- 3.0 Weighted academic grade point average in **CORE** classes (English, Math, Science, Soc. Studies)
 - To calculate your core GPA go to <https://www.unr.edu/prospective-students/agpa-calculator>
- \$60 application fee (in state tuition is \$249.00 per credit)
- Official High School Transcript <https://washoeschoolsnv.scribborder.com/>

- 2022 applicants may choose to send official SAT/ACT scores to UNR- used for class placement
- Other fees/applications:
 - Advanced Registration fee (\$125- guarantees an early freshman schedule and priority housing)
 - On-Campus Housing application available November 15th; Feb 1 is the priority cut-off date (space is limited so apply early- \$300 deposit secures your spot and is fully refundable till 6/15)
 - FAFSA- Available October 1, 2021

- **NEVADA BOUND and NEVADA BOUND LIVE:** Nevada Bound is available for prospective students and parents to visit the UNR (virtually and/or in person), learn about admissions, scholarships, financial aid, housing, tour all the residence halls, meet with academic representatives, and participate in informal discussions with current students. We strongly encourage students planning to apply/attend UNR to attend this valuable program. Registration for **Nevada Bound** days is through their website <https://admissions.unr.edu/portal/nevadabound>.

UNLV: UNLV does not require the ACT or SAT for admittance. Students can earn EITHER a 3.0 weighted core GPA, a 22 ACT composite score, an 1120 total SAT score or an advanced high school diploma. <https://www.unlv.edu/>

- Application guide and video tutorials are also available on the student account
- Must invite Counselor and teacher(s) to complete application process
- Notify Counselor ASAP if applying to a Common Application School
- **LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:** Colleges often request letters from teachers and/or counselors as part of the application process. Provide teachers/counselors with a resume and plenty of notice. **Allow a minimum of 10 school days for your recommender to write a good letter.** Many colleges also require secondary forms to be filled out by counselors. Same notice applies.

UC/CSU SCHOOLS: University of California (UC) application is open and the deadline to apply is **November 30, 2021:** <https://www.universityofcalifornia.edu/uc-system>. California State University (CSU) application opens October 1, 2021 and the deadline to apply is **November 30, 2021:** <https://www2.calstate.edu/apply>

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS: All students must use this process when requesting an official transcript.

<https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/> Fee per transcript is \$10.00 + \$4.00 processing fee for a total of \$14.00 per transcript. **YOUR FIRST (4) TRANSCRIPTS ARE FREE.**

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS (SAT (Reasoning) or ACT): Because of COVID 19 restrictions many colleges are making standardized tests optional. We recommend checking with your specific school to see if they will require them. Seniors who need them should plan to take the SAT/ACT no later than the December testing date. (Testing sites are limited due to COVID and fill up fast so register early!). Test dates and registration are available online for SAT at <https://www.collegeboard.org/> or for ACT <https://www.act.org/> Two-year colleges administer their own placement tests for English and Math and do not require the SAT/ACT but may want something similar like the Accuplacer. **RHS school code- 290145.**

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER: Students must be approved through the **NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER** if they plan to play sports at a Division I, II, or III University. Check for Eligibility Standards and Requirements. Students must take the following actions:

- Apply online at <https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/> and pay the required fee. RHS school code is 290145.
- Complete the required amateurism acknowledgement form
- Order an official transcript to be sent to the eligibility center <https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/>
- Send 1 official SAT or ACT score directly to the NCAA from the testing centers (Reno High School cannot send these scores).

MILITARY: You need your high school diploma to join the military! Research military options thoroughly and contact local recruiters (see websites and phone numbers below). Consider taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery). See Ms. Ortiz for more information.

- Official transcripts and standardized test scores (SAT, AP, ACT) are the responsibility of the student and are to be ordered and sent by the student to desired recipients.

 - Indicate, confirm, or advise student eligibility for **NCAA: All student information can be found on the NCAA website**
 - Assume any responsibility for admission requirements to Universities and Colleges: **It is the students' responsibility to research information regarding individual schools, their admission criteria, scholarships, financial aid, etc.**
 - Under no circumstances will WCSD staff estimate a student's GPA eligibility for **Millennium Scholarship: Millennium Scholarship recipients are not determined until AFTER graduation**
